

## **Moving Toward Career Success**

Proposed Workshop 1

## POINTS TO COVER:

- Addressing skills and interests (mentors and mentees should share what they've learned throughout their sessions)
  - Contrasting skills and interests (skills are more marketable than interests, and interests can change over time, whereas skills can be more constant)
- Should be *audience-centric*: ask people what they'd want to hear about the most, and incorporate that into the curriculum. An idea would be to survey people online to hear what *they* want out of such a workshop.
- Creating effective résumés and CVs (depending on career type)
  - Practical Typography's advice on résumés: <u>http://practicaltypography.com/resumes.html</u>
- Assembling references
  - Getting in contact with references from the past
  - Making a list of people you've worked successfully with in the past
    - Reminding them of what you did if needed
  - Testimonials? (more useful for creative professions)
- Working from a paradigm of adaptation, rather than a shame-based model
  - More discreet ways of stimming during an interview
- Networking autistically
  - LinkedIn how is it helpful?
  - Informational interviews a useful way for gathering information about potential career paths
- Portfolios these are essential for creative professionals, and helpful for people in other fields to demonstrate their skills, similar to Ramit Sethi's "briefcase technique"
  - Design samples
  - Photography samples
  - Writing samples (especially more polished, professional ones, e.g. grants, proposals, reports, business letters, published articles, scholarly articles)
  - Curriculum samples (for educators)
  - Other ideas?
- Homework before, during, or after interviews how to do well at it, how to identify what they're looking for
- Writing skills
  - Having résumés, CVs, and cover letters proofread before showing to employers
  - Understanding that spelling, grammar, and punctuation can be difficult
  - Sympathetic, non-ableist way of helping people polish their professional writing
- Brainstorming
